



REQUEST AND REMINDER FOR ALL UNIT OWNERS AND MEMBERS

Dear Unit Owners and Members,

Please be advised that both the Fisher Island Club and the Fisher Island Community Association are receiving complaints on an ongoing basis regarding speeding and not stopping at "Stop" signs on the island. As all of you know, we have a speed limit of 19 miles per hour. We have electronic speed detector signs to remind you when you are speeding and these have helped, but have not solved the problem.

With great frequency, we receive requests to put up more signs. The problem is that the speeders ignore the signs we have, and will ignore additional signs. They know it is dangerous to speed and ignore stop signs, and they know that golf cart drivers, pedestrians, bicyclists, and the birds often seen on roadways are endangered. Still they speed and ignore the stop signs.

Recently, FICA has been addressing speeding in its Rules and Regulations Committee, and it will continue to do so. Presently, our Public Safety Officers are photographing speeders in front of the speed detector signs and sending warning notices to them. They will subsequently be brought before the Committee for fines and repeat offenders are subject to other penalties, including denial of access to certain Common Area and Preferred Ferry Boarding Lanes for up to 60 days per occurrence. Additionally, the FICA Rules and Regulations Committee will be forwarding its records to the Fisher Island Club Rules and Regulations Committee so that repeat offenders can be addressed by the Club.

We are fortunate that we have had no loss of life as a result of these violations. All drivers, whether in golf carts or other vehicles, must be more considerate of the wildlife and the human beings on the island.
